LONG BIO – Alyssa Reynoso-Morris is a queer Afro-Latinx/e Dominican and Puerto Rican storyteller. Her ability to weave compelling stories has opened many doors for her as an author, motivational speaker, and resume writer. She is also a mother and community organizer. During the day she works with community members, non-profit organizations, and government officials to make the world a better place.

Then she puts her writer's hat on to craft heartfelt stories about home, family, food, and the fun places she has been. Alyssa was born and raised in The Bronx, New York, and currently lives in Philadelphia, PA with her partner and daughter.

Alyssa served her community as the Chief of Staff for her local State Representative. Together they worked to bring funds to the district, pass legislation, and organize events to ensure constituents' needs are met. Prior to this, Alyssa interned for Parvati Swayamrojgaar, a microfinance organization working to break the poverty cycle in the slums of India, taught English at an orphanage in Tanzania, and facilitated the establishment of the Women's Witness Protection Program for the International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda.

She also assembled a team of 70 volunteers that worked to build an aquaponic unit (a system that grows fish and crops without waste) and a water purification system in an under-resourced community in the Dominican Republic. Her team fundraised, wrote grants, and developed lesson plans focused on sustainable development. As for her writing journey, she was awarded a Yuyi Morales Diversity and More Merit Scholarship in 2020 for the Craft and Business of Writing Children's Picture Books course offered through the Children's Book Academy. She earned a Las Musas Mentorship and an Editor-Writer Mentorship from The Word for picture books in 2020. She was also selected as a mentee through the PB Chat Mentorship program but withdrew due to being offered representation.






Welcome to The Bronx, New York! A picture book celebration of hometown pride including the history, landscape, cuisines, cultures, and activities unique to this vibrant community.


Abuela says, "plátanos are love." I thought they were food. But Abuela says they feed us in more ways than one.



I did not learn to read until I was in 4th grade. I was not supposed to be an author. - What are the various paths to publication? Pros and Cons of those paths?
- Why you might need an agent? What is an agent's role? How do you find an agent and get representation? What is a query letter? How to put together a good query packet?
- What is an editor's role? How do you get an editor's attention? And more.

Why Diverse Representation is Important and Needed?

Have you felt like you don't belong? Are you the only person in a room that looks like you? As a Queer Black Latine individual, I often felt the need to assimilate or code-switch to get ahead. Let's discuss WHY representation matters and is needed. <u>Attendees will leave understanding:</u>

- Discussion about the lack of diversity in literature and why representation matters
- How my success in publishing and speaking happened after I leaned into my intersectional identity, culture, and experiences.
- How to show up in spaces authentically after you tap into your unique story.

Writing to Reconnect To Your Roots & Build Confidence

Are you struggling to reconnect with your roots? Do you need a confidence boost? Writing helped me reconnect to my roots and build my confidence, while I was struggling with generational depression. <u>Attendees will leave understanding:</u>

- How writing can help you heal and process trauma or difficult experiences?
- How writing can help you reconnect with your roots and take pride in them?
- Why improving your self-confidence is important and how writing can help you improve how you see yourself?
